In ICF, there's twenty one people in ICF, eighteen people who are in supported living, four people who are in residential habilitation, ResHab,

Three people who are in their own homes, two people in a host home and one in a nursing home, and sadly of the forty nine who have tested positive, as of today,

It's established protocols for the safety of employees,

and for the people that live there and this week DC Health also issued some updated guidance and that guidance addresses essentially face coverings and the requirement for that at ResHab's and ICF.

It also established as a requirement that any of our placements inform,

So it's really important, as I've said, before you can look at coronavirus.dc.gov, you can also look at DDS.dc.gov to get access to the most current information.

"So actually, I've heard from people who receive, excuse me, SSDI and SSI that direct deposits have already begun.

Not everyone who gets COVID-19 gets sick enough to have to go to the hospital and also not everyone who gets it even gets sick enough to know that they have it.

So, there's the possibility that you or I could have COVID-19 and not have any symptoms and that's the reason that we wear a mask when we go out.

Because if I were to cough or sneeze, because it is allergy season.
