 Concerns about causing harm because information/recordings live on forever on the internet. Following the OMA may be a barrier to getting families to share. Committee Meetings can be closed We need to make sure that meetings are accessible to voting members Concern about how much families of people with disabilities are monitored constantly through services systems, public safety, etc DC has highest rate of due process complaints. Families feel like they have to hire a lawyer to file suits or complaints and this perpetuates inequities in systems and creates barriers to entry into services. If DC operates in a complaints based system, DC needs to fund attorneys similar to public defenders. Concerns that family and family members with IDD are treated as sub-human.

		 A robust ombudsman team or pubic attorney would need to include training on how to support families and complex situation including involvement criminal justice system and child welfare. Families are concerned about harm and retaliation if they speak about "problems" in public forums. Having a safe space for families is high priority for FSC members.
