Work Incentives make it possible for you to keep your Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and/or health care benefits while you test your ability to work.

- Addressing barriers to employment;

- Information and Referral.

What is Ticket to Work?



The Ticket to Work Program offers employment support and services including vocational rehabilitation, training and job referrals to help you reach your employment goals.
